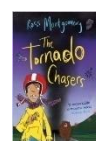

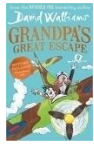
#### **The Tornado Chasers** Ross Montgomery

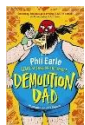
**The Sound of Whales** Kerr Thomson
